
#### JUST SOME STUFF!

Mandatory: Do not fold your cards after the board has been played until everyone at the table agrees to the result.
Suggestion: After the bidding, keep bid cards face up until

opening lead has been made. This will solve the problem of who is on lead and having to review the bidding

\* <u>Suggestion</u>: Sort cards after play of the hand, if there is time, before passing the boards to the next table, so that the game can move on quickly.

Other suggestions you may have will be greatly appreciated.



Answer: **It is not a singleton!** If it were, declarer would have opened one spade (having 5). Don't expect partner to ruff if you take the A and lead a spade back. Simple arithmetic!

## MORE SUIT PREFERENCE

Continuing the discussion about this helpful defensive tool (Suit Preference) from last month, we offer the following scenario

West leads the K of hearts. Since East sees a singleton on the board and, if continued, a heart will be trumped, he can direct the defense. He has at least three hearts from which to choose (partner knows this also as East raised his opening heart bid). East would like West to switch to a diamond, so he plays his highest heart (9) to show his interest in the diamond suit (the higher ranking of the other 2 suits - not counting trump). If he wanted a club switch, he would play his lowest heart. Since West trusts his partner completely, he leads the K of diamonds (start of a doubleton), then plays his diamond to East, who takes the ace, leads another diamond which then gets ruffed, **SETTING THE CONTRACT!** What a great partnership!
